## As at 30 June 2026

Post-implementation Reviews (PIRs) are required for proposals that have substantial impacts, for proposals granted an exemption from the Government's Impact Analysis (IA) requirements by the Prime Minister, and for proposals that were non-compliant with the Government's IA requirements. PIRs should be completed within two years of implementation where exceptional circumstances were granted or a proposal was assessed as non-compliant. PIRs should be completed within five years of implementation for proposals likely to have a substantial impact.

In addition to the completed and published PIRs, fourteen PIRs are no longer required because the regulation is no longer in force or the proposal is no longer Government policy.

Please note that all Department and Agency names in this report reflect their name at the time of the completion and publishing of the PIR.
