Radiocommunications Licence Conditions (Maritime Ship Licence) Determination 2015

I am writing to the Office of Best Practice Regulation (OBPR) regarding the Radiocommunications Licence Conditions (Maritime Ship Licence) Determination 2002 (Maritime Ship LCD) which, as per the Legislative Instruments Act 2003, is scheduled to sunset on 1 April 2015. The Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA) has decided to remake the instrument without significant amendment.

The ACMA certifies that the Maritime Ship LCD is operating effectively and efficiently, and that as such, a Regulation Impact Statement is not required for this instrument to continue in its current form. The OBPR reference number is 17346.

The assessment that the Maritime Ship LCD is operating effectively and efficiently has been informed by a consultation process which involved consulting with the general public over the period 18 December 2014 to 5 February 2015.

I acknowledge that the OBPR will publish this letter for transparency purposes as part of a consolidated list relating to regulatory instruments which continue in force instead of sunsetting as scheduled.
