Radiocommunications (Cordless Communications Devices) Class Licence 2001 and the Radiocommunications (Cellular Mobile Telecommunications Devices) Class Licence 2002

I am writing to the Office of Best Practice Regulation (OBPR) regarding the Radiocommunications (Cordless Communications Devices) Class Licence 2001 (Cordless Devices Class Licence) and the Radiocommunications (Cellular Mobile Telecommunications Devices) Class Licence 2002 (Cellular Devices Class Licence) which, as per the Legislative Instruments Act 2003, were both scheduled to sunset on 1 April 2015. However, the Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA) has decided to remake the instruments without significant amendment.

The ACMA certifies that the Cordless Devices Class Licence and the Cellular Devices Class Licence are each operating effectively and efficiently, and that as such, Regulation Impact Statements are not required for these instruments to be remade. The OBPR reference numbers are 16210 and 16211.

The assessment that the instruments are operating effectively and efficiently has been informed by a consultation process which involved consulting with the general public over the period 12 December 2013 to 5 February 2014.

I acknowledge that the OBPR will publish this letter for transparency purposes as part of a consolidated list relating to regulatory instruments which continue in force instead of sunsetting as scheduled.
