Radiocommunications Licence Conditions (Aeronautical Licence) Determination No.1 of 1997 and Radiocommunications (Radio-controlled Models) Class Licence 2002

I am writing to the Office of Best Practice Regulation (OBPR) regarding the Radiocommunications Licence Conditions (Aeronautical Licence) Determination No. 1 of 1997 (Aeronautical LCD) and Radiocommunications (Radio-controlled Models) Class Licence 2002 (Radio-controlled Models Class Licence) which , as per the Legislative Instruments Act 2003, are scheduled to sunset on 1 October 2015. However, the Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA) has decided to remake these instruments without significant amendment.

The ACMA certifies that the Aeronautical LCD and Radio-controlled Models Class Licence are each operating effectively and efficiently, and that as such, a Regulation Impact Statement is not required for these instruments to continue in their current form. The OBPR reference number is 16586.

The assessment that these instruments are operating effectively and efficiently has been informed by a consultation process which involved consulting with the general public over the period 14 March 2014 and 28 April 2014.

I acknowledge that OBPR will publish this letter for transparency purposes as part of a consolidated list relating to regulatory instruments which continue in force instead of sunsetting as scheduled.
