## **Therapeutic Goods Advertising Code 2007**

I am writing to the Office of Best Practice Regulation (OBPR) regarding the Therapeutic Goods Advertising Code 2007, which, as per the *Legislative Instruments Act 2003*, is scheduled to sunset on 1 April 2017. However, the Department of Health has decided that the instrument is to be remade without significant amendment. The Therapeutic Goods Advertising Code is an essential component of the therapeutic goods advertising regulatory framework.

The Department of Health certifies that Therapeutic Goods Advertising Code is operating effectively and efficiently to ensure that the marketing and advertising of therapeutic goods to consumers is conducted in a manner that promotes the quality use of therapeutic goods, is socially responsible and does not mislead or deceive the consumer. Accordingly a Regulation Impact Statement (RIS) is not required for this instrument to be remade with minor and technical amendments. The OBPR reference number is 19757.

The assessment that the regulation is operating effectively and efficiently has been informed by consultation processes more recently which involved the therapeutic goods industry and peak representative bodies from that industry, healthcare providers and consumers and the Therapeutic Goods Advertising Code Council (a statutory body established to provide a consultative forum on and make recommendations about the Code).

Please note the Code is expected to be reconsidered following the Government's response to Part 2 of the *Review of Medicines and Medical Devices Regulation*. A RIS may be required to be undertaken as part of this process.
