## Regulation Impact Statement – Second-pass final assessment – Banking exemption order for religious charitable development funds

Thank you for submitting the Regulation Impact Statement (RIS) for the above proposal to the Office of Best Practice Regulation (OBPR) for second-pass final assessment on 9 March 2016. I note that the RIS has been formally certified at the Chairman level consistent with best practice.

The OBPR's final assessment is that the Australian Prudential Regulation Authority is compliant with the Government's RIS requirements but is not consistent with best practice because:

• the conclusion that the preferred option in the RIS is likely to result in the highest net benefit is not clearly supported by the analysis in the RIS.

## Publication requirements

The OBPR maintains a RIS website. We would appreciate you advising us when a decision on this proposal is announced, and forwarding a final copy of the RIS and your certification letter in *Microsoft Word .doc* format in a form meeting the Australian Government's *Web Content Accessibility Guidelines*.

We suggest liaising with your web services team to ensure these guidelines are met. The OBPR should be consulted if the RIS is amended. It is the agency preparing the RIS, not the OBPR, which is responsible for the content of the published RIS.

The website provides a public comment facility on RISs posted on the site. The OBPR moderates this facility for offensive content but does not moderate debate.
