Re: Digital Radio Multiplex Transmitter Licences (Decision-Making Criteria) Determination 2008 (OBPR ID: 23634)

We write regarding the Digital Radio Multiplex Transmitter Licences (Decision-Making Criteria) Determination 2008 (the instrument), which, as per the *Legislation Act 2003*, are scheduled to sunset on 1 October 2018. The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) has reviewed the need for the instrument and considers that it should be remade without significant amendment.

The ACCC certifies that the instrument is operating effectively and efficiently. The ACCC does not consider that a Regulation Impact Statement is required for this regulation to be remade. The proposed changes to the instrument and the explanatory statement are not significant.

The assessment that the regulation is operating effectively and efficiently has been informed by a review to determine whether the instrument is still 'fit for purpose' and consultation with stakeholders.

The ACCC commenced a public consultation process on 23 March 2018 inviting submissions on the proposed repeal of the existing instrument and remaking of a new instrument (with no significant changes proposed). Submissions endorsed the ACCC remaking the instrument in substantially the same form as the sunsetting instrument. The ACCC made minor changes to the instrument's explanatory statement in response to issues raised.
