Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Regulations 1989

I am writing to the Office of Best Practice Regulation (OBPR) regarding the *Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Regulations 1989* (the ACT Self-Government Regulations), which, as per the *Legislation Act 2003*, are scheduled to sunset on 1 April 2022. It has been decided that the instrument is to be remade without significant amendment.

The Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Communications certifies that the ACT Self-Government Regulations are operating effectively and efficiently, and that a Regulation Impact Statement is not required for these regulations to be remade.

The assessment that the regulations are operating effectively and efficiently has been informed by a consultation process which involved the ACT Government, National Capital Authority and relevant Australian Government departments, over the period of 2020 to 2021.

I also note that the regulatory burden to business, community organisations or individuals has been quantified using the Australian Government's *Regulatory Burden Measurement framework*. These are provided below.
