### **Telecommunications (Prohibition of Mobile Phone Boosters) Declaration 2011**

I am writing to the Office of Best Practice Regulation (OBPR) regarding the Telecommunications (Prohibition of Mobile Phone Boosters) Declaration 2011, which, as per the *Legislation Act 2003*, had been scheduled to sunset on 1 October 2021. However, it has been decided that the instrument is to be remade without significant amendment.

The Australian Communications and Media Authority certifies that the *Telecommunications (Prohibition of Mobile Phone Boosters) Declaration 2011* is operating effectively and efficiently, and that therefore a Regulation Impact Statement is not required for this regulation to be remade.

The assessment that the regulation is operating effectively and efficiently has been informed by a consultation process which involved relevant industry stakeholders including mobile network operators over the period 19 April 2021 to 18 May 2021.

I also note that the regulatory burden to business, community organisations or individuals has been quantified using the Australian Government's *Regulatory Burden Measurement framework*. These are provided below.
