***National Health (Concession card or entitlement card fee) Determination 2012
(PB 102 of 2011)***

I am writing to the Office of Best Practice Regulation (OBPR) regarding the *National Health (Concession card or entitlement card fee) Determination 2012* (PB 102 of 2011) (Determination), which, as per the *Legislation Act 2003*, had been scheduled to sunset on 1 April 2022. It has been decided that the instrument is to be remade without significant amendment.

The Department of Health certifies that the Determination is operating effectively and efficiently, and that therefore a Regulation Impact Statement is not required for this regulation to be remade.

The assessment that the regulation is operating effectively and efficiently has been informed by consultation with the Pharmacy Guild of Australia in each year of operation of the Determination and most recently in November 2021.

There is not regulatory burden to business, community organisations or individuals arising from remaking of the Determination.
