## Impact Analysis – Resolution Approach to Income Apportionment – Second Pass Final Assessment

I am writing in relation to the attached Impact Analysis (IA) prepared for the resolution of income apportionment.

I am satisfied the IA addresses the concerns raised in your letters of 18 July 2025, concerning the First Pass drafts on this issue. Specifically, it:

- ensures the objectives of Government action established in question 2 of the IA match the criteria used to analyse the net benefit of the proposed options, and explains the extent to which the proposed options achieve these objectives
- methodically analyses the impacts of the options
- provides explicit evidence-based details of the consequences of income apportionment, including impacts on individuals' wellbeing
- provides a more detailed overview of the status quo, and the benefits of alternative policy options by comparison.
