Impact Analysis – Australian screen content requirements for streaming services – Second Pass Final Assessment

I am writing in relation to the attached Impact Analysis (IA) for the proposal to introduce Australian screen content requirements on subscription video on-demand (streaming) services.

I am satisfied that the IA addresses the concerns raised in your letter of 29 February 2024. Specifically, the IA includes further analysis of how the proposed policy improves the sustainability of the Australian screen content industry to deliver broader public benefit to Australians, includes a section on risk management, and additional identification and quantitative assessment of the full range of likely costs and benefits.

The regulatory burden to business, community organisations or individuals is quantified using the Australian Government's *Regulatory Burden Measurement* framework and is provided below.

and sport) on new Australian commissions and first release acquisitions: or		
a voluntary revenue option for streaming services to acquit the requirement by calculating their content obligation based on 75 per cent of the expenditure requirement numerator.

I submit the IA to the Office of Impact Analysis for formal final assessment.
